Five facts about the **CHILD LABOUR RISK IDENTIFICATION MODEL**

What is it?

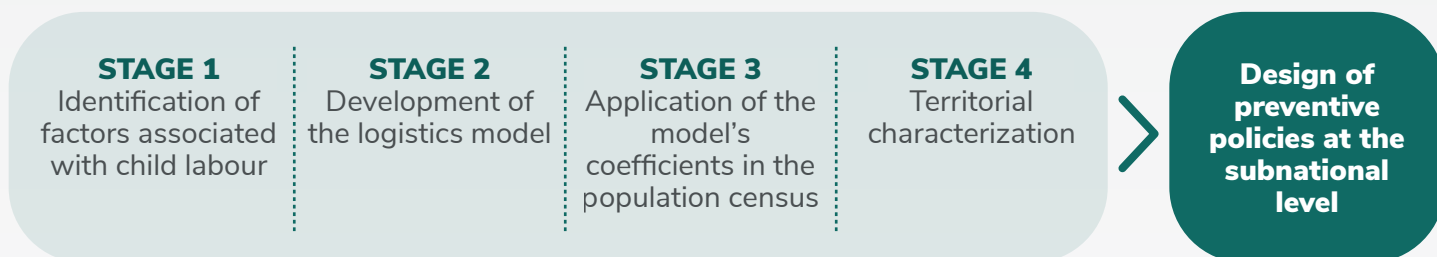
A tool developed by ILO and ECLAC that, based on existing statistical information in the countries (surveys, censuses and / or administrative records), allows to identify the territories most vulnerable to child labour and estimate the weight of various associated factors.



What is it for?

- Design, implement and measure the impact of **preventive child labour interventions**.
- Promote and / or strengthen **policy dialogue** and **coordination** at the local level.
- **Focus the intervention** based on evidence and in accordance with national and subnational goals.
- Include child labour interventions in targeted and universal **public services and programs**.

Child labour risk maps and a characterization that includes guidelines to prioritize territories and to formulate or adapt public policies.



How much does it cost?



Economic resources

- Technical staff
- Redesign of a program / service
- Creation / adaptation of new services (offer)



Institutional resources

- Political will to produce, use and update data
- Computer equipment and program



Management resources

- Intersectoral coordination
- Coordination between different levels of the Government
- Promotion of public-private partnerships
