

Five facts about the **CHILD LABOUR RISK IDENTIFICATION MODEL**

What is it?

A tool developed by ILO and ECLAC that, based on existing statistical information in the countries (surveys, censuses and / or administrative records),

allows to identify the territories most vulnerable child labour to and estimate the weight of various associated factors.



What is it for?

- Design, implement and measure the impact of preventive child labour interventions.
- Promote and / or strengthen policy dialogue and coordination at the local level.
- Focus the intervention based on evidence and in accordance with national and subnational goals.
- Include child labour interventions in targeted and universal public services and programs.

How is it implemented?

STAGE 1 Identification of with child labour

STAGE 2 Development of factors associated the logistics model

STAGE 3 Application of the model's coefficients in the population census

STAGE 4 Territorial characterization

Design of preventive policies at the subnational level

What is the result?

Child labour risk maps and a characterization that includes auidelines to prioritize territories and to formulate or adapt public policies.
